We're Brad and Sarah— we're adventure enthusiasts, hospitable friends, loyal family, and adoptive parents. We met 18 years ago on our high school cross country team; over time our friendship became love, we were married after college and have been building a life together over the last 10 years. We've lived an adventure that's brought us from living overseas in South Africa to the University of Colorado's campus where we've invested in the lives of over hundreds of college students to buying/renovating Brad's grandparents house in Longmont, CO. But our greatest adventure has been stepping into parenthood. Our life is lived with others in mind and our home is a hub where family and friends gather around the table for tasty food and the occasional competitive game. We've loved adding our daughter to the mix and are eager to fill our table with more little faces— we know we have more unconditional love to give.

Our story is long, we're filled with joy and gratitude when we get to re-live it, but in so many ways its never what we would've predicted or ever planned. Maybe you can relate. Life is full of unforeseen challenges and changes. As we've faced heartaches and hard decisions we've often wished we could write a different story for ourselves. If you're reading this its likely because this little life you're growing wasn't part of your plan. We can empathize with things not going as planned.
